- 政治爭鬥和暴力充斥,尤其是在國民黨和中 华会馆以及致公堂之間




1915年軍事社和美洲華僑敢死先鋒隊

- ●直到1920年孫中山頒發 獎章和獎狀








- 1913年二次革命后孙中山的中华革命党在北美的激进活动

Mr. Truesdale, in a letter to the editor, states that he is "considerable grieved" because certain students oppose the munitions shipments to China, I suggest that Mr. Truesdale, and others that share his views, read the books and articles of such writers as Edgar Snow, Gunther Stein, Anna Louise Strong and Israel Epstein. These people have travelled extensively in both Nationalist and Communist China. They report that social and economic reform is being carried out in the Communist areas while in the Nationalist areas it most certainly is not.

Even the conservative correspondent. Owen Lattimore, says that the Communists are winning the support of the Chinese people by their ocial reform measures. And Robert Martin, the New York Post's correspondent in China, gives the same view. (Read his article "A Chinese Village goes Red" New Re-

public. Nov. 24 1947.)

Those of us who last year had the opportunity of hearing Col. Don Faris and Dr. James Endicott, both with twenty years experience in conclusive evidence that the Com-China, and who both speak the language will remember that they condemned the corrupt Chiang Kai Chek regime and spoke highly of the progress made in the Communist areas Some UBC students, myself included, have visited China in the past few years: we have been able to see the extent of the corruption profiteering, and poverty in Nattional China, and to talk with those who have witnessed the progress made in areas won from the Nation-

There are other significant factors: first, that the socialist and liberal parties, such as the democratic league which were once part of the Kucmintang coalition, have been expelled for Communist sympathy, and many of their leaders have been executed; second, many hear it. prominent non-Commuists including over a hundred ex-Natioalist

geerals, have gone over to the Communist side: third, thousands of peasants have deserted to the Communists; fourth, there is no munists have received outside aid, while Canada and the U.S. have sent billions of dollars worth of aid to bolster the Kucmintang regime (also, according to Col. Faris, Nationalist China received 98 percent of the UNRRA aid); fifth, the trade union and student movements in China are becoming increasingly anti-Kuomintang and pro-Communist.

It is my firm conviction that the shipment of arms to Nationalist China is a tragic mistake and will only prolong the civil war. Opposing Communism by supporting fascism, cannot succeed, and will have the ultimate result of strengthening Communism. If there is anyone who has evidence to contradict this view, I would certainly like to




